

Joint Specialization in English and History (60 credits)

This program will apply to all students entering the Joint Specialization in English and History program from Fall 2022 forward. For the previous program, see the document “Joint Specialization in English and History, 2015-2022.”

The Joint Specialization in English and History requires 60 credits; the History credits move through introductory, intermediate, and advanced levels and explore different fields of history through breadth requirements.

History

3 Credits	HIST 200 Introduction to History HIST 200 is a First Year Seminar on a focused topic (a “deep dive” into a historical subject) that introduces students to how historians make arguments, how they use historical evidence and other scholars’ writing, and how they communicate their ideas. There are several sections of HIST 200 offered in the Fall and Winter terms, each with a different topic.
