






Structure of the Major in International Business

The major in International Business requires the completion of 24 credits (8 courses). These include three required courses (9 credits) and 15 additional elective credits of business courses or a mix of elective credits chosen from both business and non-business courses that cover international issues. These latter courses (ECON, POLI) are not shown in this flowchart.



Notes:

- 1. A prerequisite refers to a course that should be completed before the course that appears at the tip of the arrow (——). For example, IBUS 462 must be completed before IBUS 465.
- 2. The international business courses appear **bolded**. The three required courses appear in **bolded** and underlined.
- 3. COMM courses that are prerequisites to IBUS courses are shown next to the IBUS courses.
- 4. Students are strongly encouraged to enrol in language courses as elective courses. Adding a minor in another area of interest is also recommended to further complement this program. Participation in the Concordia Student Exchange Program is also highly recommended.
- 5. To review the course requirements for your year of entry in the program please refer to the <u>undergraduate calendar</u> or <u>degree worksheet</u> for that year.
- 6. Students are responsible for following the correct sequence of courses required for the completion of a particular major. Students who fail a course must repeat it before taking the next course.
- 7. The Minor in International Business consists of IBUS 462, 466, 492, and one course from Group A.
