FUNDING YOUR GRADUATE DEGREE

Financial considerations are an important factor in planning your graduate career. This is why all graduate students applying to Arts and Science are automatically considered for entrance scholarships and fellowships, tuition remissions and teaching assistantships. Applicants to research-based programs are also considered for research assistantships and bursaries.

Applying for Provincial or Federal research awards? Newly admitted students receiving government funding receive a Special Entrance Award valued at \$6,000 for Master's and \$10,000 for Doctoral students. Apply for these graduate scholarships when preparing your program application and benefit from Concordia's top-up funding.

In-program students can receive financial support through awards and prizes in recognition of excellence, as teaching and research assistantships, for presenting at conferences, to engage in fieldwork, and as incentives to graduate sooner.
