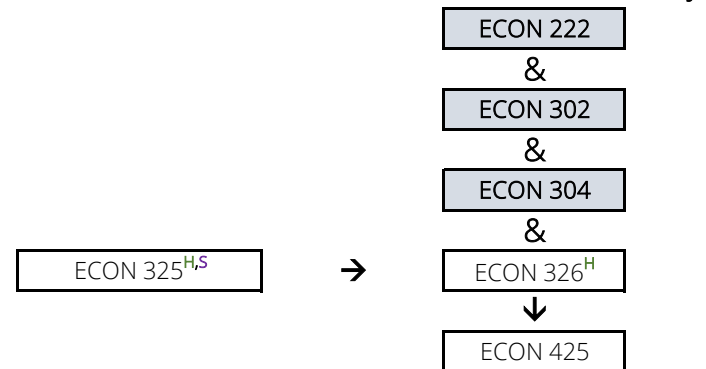

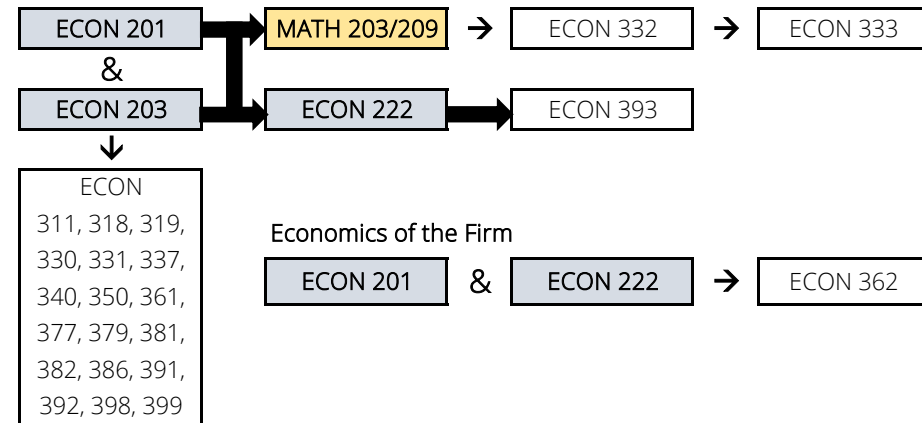

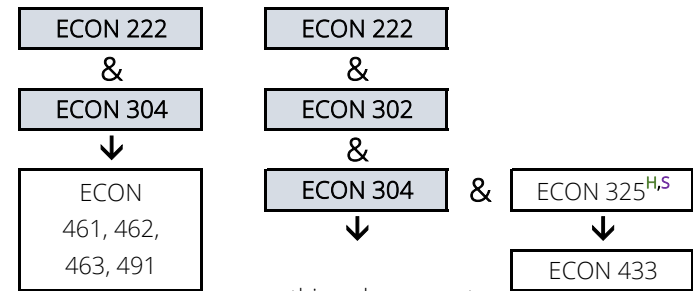

Legend

Arrows (down/left/right)	Path from prerequisite to more advanced course; cannot be taken concurrently
&	Must complete all courses linked by '&' sign to advance to next course in sequence. May be taken concurrently.
	Must complete both courses (concurrently or one after another) to advance to the next course in the sequence.
	Grants access to two separate courses.
Gray & bold boxes	Core courses common to all BA Economics students
Yellow boxes	Math prerequisites: may be used to fulfill General Education requirement. Students with exemptions cannot retain credit unless granted permission
H (green font)	Course specifically required for the BA Honours Economics
S (purple font)	Course specifically required for the BA Specialization Economics
