

## Joint Specialization in English and History (60 credits)

This program will apply to all students entering the Joint Specialization in English and History program from Fall 2022 forward.

For the previous program, see the document “Joint Specialization in English and History, 2015-2022.”

The Joint Specialization in English and History requires 60 credits; the History credits move through introductory, intermediate, and advanced levels and explore different fields of history through breadth requirements.

### English

- 6 Credits ENGL 261, 262
- 6 Credits Chosen from the Periods Before 1800 (British) Literature course group
- 6 Credits Chosen from the Canadian Literature, American Literature, and Postcolonial English Literature Course Groups
- 6 Credits Chosen from the 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> century (British and European) Literature course group
- 6 Credits Chosen from the English Literature Electives List

### History

- 3 Credits HIST 200 Introduction to History  
 HIST 200 is a First Year Seminar on a focused topic (a “deep dive” into a historical subject) that introduces students to how historians make arguments, how they use historical evidence and other scholars’ writing, and how they communicate their ideas. There are several sections of HIST 200 offered in the Fall and Winter terms, each with a different topic.
- 12 Credits HIST courses at the 200 level
- 9 Credits HIST courses at the 300 level
- 6 Credits HIST courses at the 300 or 400 level

### **General Education rule**
