Collaborative discussions and peer feedback provide diverse perspectives and critical insights, fostering a more comprehensive and balanced approach to research. This communal engagement also promotes the development of ethical standards and shared practices, as emphasized by Dickson-Swift et al. (2009).

Not only will this strengthen the community and create a safe space for us at the CSLP to talk about our progress and process, but also it would serve as training in case, for example, you haven't been part of a panel to talk about your work and/or self as a researcher.
