Fillion, E., **Monson**, E., **Loignon**, C., & **Morvannou**, A. (2023). <u>Women who gamble online:</u> a <u>scoping review</u>. Addiction Research & Theory (2023). This article is the first to review existing research on women who gamble online. The findings highlight the general and unique motivations for why women gamble online, and the negative consequences associated with it.

Marionneau, V., **Ruohio**, H., & **Karlsson**, N. (2023). <u>Gambling harm prevention and harm reduction in online environments: a call for action.</u> In this article, the authors review efforts to reduce risks and prevent harm from online gambling. They discuss universal measures to prevent and reduce harm at the population level, including measures such as regulating the supply and availability of online JHAs.

Marie-Line Tovar. (2024). Les Jeux D'argent et de hasard en ligne des 15-17 ans: pratiques et consequences. ARPEJ. New analyses of the ENJEU-Minors study, which interviewed a sample of minors aged 15 to 17 years in 2021, enabled to compare online gambling activities and those in points of sale. In fact, half of young people aged 15 to 17 years who declared participating in gambling on the Internet reported gambling on more games and to make bets more frequently and higher amounts than those who reported gambling at points of sale.

Gambling Commission. (2023). <u>Young People and Gambling 2023</u>. This report contains the findings from the Gambling Commission's annual study, produced by Ipsos, exploring gambling behaviours among young people in Great Britain. The research was conducted in schools, with pupils completing online self-completion surveys in class. The study collected data from a sample of 3,453 11 to 17 year olds attending schools in England, Scotland, and Wales.
