



Open Call Research Internship, Research for the Frontlines

Fall 2024

Indigenous students will be paired with Indigenous communities or organizations on the front lines of the fight for environmental and climate justice to conduct research projects.

Through this internship, you will:

- Learn about climate and environmental justice for Indigenous communities in Canada
- Learn about and use Indigenous research practices
- Access a network of like-minded peers and allies that produce high-quality research

Examples of research projects you could collaborate on:

- Conduct a literature review on Indigenous and scientific knowledge about bird population in a specific area
- Prepare an accessible summary of research findings for a community
- Analyze environmental policies
- Create an interactive map of logging activities

Eligible students:

- Currently enrolled Concordia students in an undergraduate or graduate degree program
- Identify as First Nation, Métis and Inuit in Canada
- Have a social insurance number and a bank account with a Canadian institution

How does it work?

You will be matched with 1 or 2 Indigenous-led research projects based on your interests and skills. Over the term, you will work on the research projects with support from a supervisor and peer mentor. Most of the work will be done remotely with the possibility of accessing an office space on Concordia downtown campus.

The internship is part-time (10-15 hours/week) between September 2 and November 22, 2024. You will be paid by receiving an honorarium equivalent to an hourly rate between \$20-\$25/h.

If you are eligible, you can apply for course credit for the internship. This aspect is not managed by the OCE, but we can offer guidance to connect with your program and academic advisor!
