# Using Concordia Library Spaces


Webster Library has dedicated graduate student space on the 5th floor of LB in the dissertation writer's rooms, lounge and kitchen. Use your student ID to access the space, if your student ID won't give you access to the grad space, go to the Ask Us desk on the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor for assistance. Lockers in the grad spaces are available at the Webster Loans Desk on a first come, first served basis, **starting on Sept 30, 2024.** 

### Borrowing books and other materials at Concordia

- Sofia Discovery Tool is the library catalogue, with access to print books, ebooks, articles, and media
- Borrow up 100 items at a time (books and media), with your student ID card
- Books can be borrowed for 30 days, (with automatic renewals)
- Students can place a hold on print books and request print books from Vanier library using the request button in Sofia
- Students can request scans of articles from Concordia print journals or chapters from Concordia print books, via the <u>Article/Chapter Scan & Deliver</u> service and will be emailed to you as a PDF
- Students can borrow laptops for 3 days from the Loans/Circulation desk

### Borrowing books and requesting ejournal articles from other libraries


 Concordia users may borrow print books from other Quebec University libraries, and print books from libraries worldwide through interlibrary loans, look for these buttons in Sofia:



**Note**: Ebooks are <u>not</u> available to borrow or access from Quebec University libraries or Libraries Worldwide due to licensing.

- Interlibrary loans can also be used to request a single chapter from an ebook not owned by Concordia.
- If there is an entire ebook you wish to access, contact Michelle, she may be able to buy it for the library, or obtain a print copy; there are also some instances where you could go to another university and access the ebook on site, at their library (McGill for instance).
