Volt-Age Impact Grant Evaluation Criteria and Merit Indicators

During the review process, the review committee assigns a rating to each application. These ratings are used to create a ranked list of applications, which the Volt-Age CFREF uses to allocate funding. Funding is awarded in order of ranking until all available funds are exhausted or no additional applications meet the funding criteria.

The priority-driven peer review mechanism will use a scale of 0.0 to 5.0 to rate applications, with 5.0 being the highest possible rating. Scores are assigned in increments of 0.1 to ensure precision in the evaluation process. Reviewers are encouraged to use the full range of rating scores to accurately reflect the quality and competitiveness of each application. Ratings are assigned qualitative descriptors (see Tables below) to help guide reviewers in their rating of applications. For an application to be eligible for funding, it must receive a score of 3.0 or higher.
